UPDATES

- The County has developed a Kenosha County specific COVID-19 dashboard and resource hub for the county website that will go live this week.
- Institute for Health Metrics and Evaluation has developed a <u>COVID-19 projection webpage</u> to determine when the resource peak for each state. This model is updated daily based on data availability. The projections assume the continuation of strong social distancing measures and other protective measures. Note that the projections produced by this model can change rapidly.
- Froedtert South moved their COVID-19 testing tent from Pleasant Prairie to the downtown hospital location. It is opened M/W/F from 8:00am-1:00pm by appointment only.
- Aurora in need of new and unused N95 and procedural masks; unopened, personal-sized hand sanitizer (comprised of least 60% alcohol); new or unused goggles, safety glasses or face shields, and un-opened disinfectant wipes. Please contact COVIDAAHSupplyDonations@aurora.org for additional information about how and where to make donations. They have also launched the COVID-19 Resource Center to help patients and broader community navigate resources, access updated information and learn how and when to access care.
- Aurora is requiring that all external EMS have their temperature taken at our ED entrance upon arrival. They have closed down to one entrance for all patients and visitors (only those meeting their no visitor policy exceptions are allowed) arrivals. Screening questions and temperatures are taken at this entry point and marked accordingly. Anyone with positive responses to the questions and/or a temperature are not allowed entry, and referred appropriately.

KENOSHA TRANSPORTATION

Kenosha Area Transit (public city bus)

- All routes are currently running
- Service is on the hour (no half hour service during peak times)
- No fares are being collected at this time
- Passengers board through the rear door. Those needing to enter through the front (ADA riders) alert the driver. Care-A-Van (paratransit)
- Care-A-Van is running the same hours as the city bus
- No fare is being charged
- Riders may be able to make same-day trip requests. .

Western Kenosha County Transit (rural public bus)

- Schedule only door-to-door trips to help facilitate social distancing. Fixed routes are still running
- The fare for door-to-door has temporarily been reduced to \$2.00 one way
- This is a PUBLIC bus service so anyone living west of I-94 may use this service
- If a rider has a question about the monthly bus pass make a Mobility Manager referral in Mr. Cool
- Some trip requests to neighboring Wisconsin counties and Milwaukee may occur based on availability.

Volunteer Transportation

- Operating as normal, but with lower capacities due to volunteers adhering to the state of emergency orders
- Making referrals to Care-A-Van if they are unable to accommodate a ride due to lack of volunteers
- Fares remain the same at this time
